# EUSA ANNUAL AWARD REGULATIONS

## THE MOST ACTIVE NUSA AWARD

- EAA 1** The Most Active National University Sports Association is determined by the highest number of points earned from organising and participating in EUSA events during the year (January 1 – December 31), as follows:
- 25 points for participation in an event,
  - 1 point per each delegation member (Independently of whether the delegation is composed by more than the allowed maximum number defined in the Technical Regulations, the maximum number defined in the Technical Regulation will be considered).

## THE MOST ACTIVE UNIVERSITY AWARD

- EAA 2** The Most Active University is the University with the highest points obtained by participating in the EUSA events, summed as follow: (total university participants / total annual participants x 100).

## NUSA MEDAL WINNER AWARD

- EAA 3** The NUSA Medal Winner Award is determined by the medal standings across all EUSA events during the year (January 1 – December 31). In case of an equal number of gold medals, silver medals shall be considered, followed by bronze medals. If universities are tied for the first place, multiple universities can be awarded.

## UNIVERSITY MEDAL WINNER AWARD

- EAA 4** The University Medal Winner Award is determined by the medal standings across all EUSA events during the year (January 1 – December 31). In case of an equal number of gold medals, silver medals shall be considered, followed by bronze medals. If universities are tied for the first place, multiple universities can be awarded.

## THE MOST SUCCESSFUL NUSA AWARD

- EAA 5** The Most Successful National University Sports Association is determined by the highest points achieved in the final rankings of EUSA events during the year (January 1 – December 31), in accordance with EUSA pointing system defined in "EUSA Most Successful Pointing system".

## THE MOST SUCCESSFUL UNIVERSITY AWARD

- EAA 6** The Most Successful University is the university with the highest points obtained at the final ranking in the EUSA events in a year (January 1 – December 31), in accordance with EUSA pointing system defined in “EUSA Most Successful Pointing system”.
- EAA 7** For Most Successful awards, the following sports are calculated using only the EUSA pointing system based on final ranking: 3×3 Basketball, Basketball, Beach Handball, Beach Volleyball, Football, Futsal, Handball, Padel, Rugby 7s Snow Volleyball, Tennis, Volleyball, Water Polo.
- EAA 8** For Most Successful awards, any competitions including more than 24 teams, the maximum points attributed are equal to 24 teams.
- EAA 9** EUSA Most Successful Pointing System:

**EAA 10** The following sports have specific calculations to determine points, detailed per sport below:

### 1. Athletics

- Each competition (individual and team) – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking[LS6] list, and from this ranking only the top 8 are taken into account (when tied at 8<sup>th</sup> position, all teams are included).

### 2. Alpine Skiing

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking.

### 3. Badminton

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Team competition – use EUSA pointing system based on Final ranking
- EUSA Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system again.

### 4. Chess

- Individual men – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Team men competition – use EUSA pointing system based on Final ranking
- Individual women – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Team women competition – use EUSA pointing system based on Final ranking
- EUSA Final ranking (men and women) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system again.

### 5. Judo

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking.

### 6. Karate

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking.

### 7. Kickboxing

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking.

### 8. Orienteering

- Individual competitions – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- use EUSA pointing system based on Final ranking

## 9. Powerlifting

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final team ranking – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking. [LS7]

## 10. Rowing

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking.

## 11. Snowboarding

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking.

## 12. Swimming

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final team ranking – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking. [LS8]

## 13. Table Tennis

- Individual men – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Team men competition – use EUSA pointing system based on Final ranking
- Individual women – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Team women competition – use EUSA pointing system based on Final ranking
- EUSA Final ranking (men and women) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system again.

## 14. Taekwondo

- Individual – 1<sup>st</sup> gets 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> gets 2 points and 3<sup>rd</sup> gets 1 point
- Final ranking (mixed) – sum the points from Individual points and points from team competition and then use EUSA pointing system. Only Universities with medals are taken into account for ranking.

## THE ENNO HARMS FAIR PLAY AWARD

- EAA 11** The Enno Harms Fair Play Award is named after the EUSA first President Mr Enno Harms, who dedicated their life to the university sports movement. He was the EUSA President from 1999 to 2005 and in 2005 he was nominated Honorary President of EUSA. He was a member of the Executive Committee of the German University Sports Federation (ADH) since 1973, and its President between 1991 and 1992. Professionally he was connected to the University of Hanover as its Director of the Department for University Sport.
- EAA 12** The Enno Harms Fair Play Award is given to the best fair play gesture, act, or initiative, and recognises individuals or university teams who have demonstrated exemplary behaviour, integrity, and sportsmanship during EUSA sports events.
- EAA 13** EUSA shall prepare an online form for any participant at EUSA sports events to fill out, proposing nominations for this award, open during the regular season of EUSA Sports Events. EUSA Office shall review the proposals and make a proposal for EUSA EC for confirmation.
- EAA 14** EUSA Office are not obliged to only consider the proposals made through the above-mentioned form, and they can propose their own proposal, which should be submitted to EUSA EC with full justification.
