LORENZ URSPRUNG

Lorenz Ursprung has been director of the Academic Sports Association of Zurich ASVZ for the last 11 years. With its 70'000 active members totaling over 1.6 million visits to its various sports facilities, ASVZ is the largest university sports association in Switzerland.

Before ASVZ, Lorenz Ursprung was Head of Sport Policy and Sports Promotion and member of the board of directors at the Swiss Federal Office of Sports. He is also Vice President of Swiss University Sports and Vice President of the Zurich Sports Association.

Lorenz Ursprung served as Treasurer on the Executive Board of EUSA from 2016 until 2021. As head of the Finance and Marketing Commission he initiated and led the process of designing the EUSA Development Strategy which was adopted by the General Assembly

in 2019 and implemented since then. When the EUSA Institute was founded, he served on the board. As Treasurer he helped secure EUSA operations from the financial side during the pandemic, at the same time setting up a new accounting system.

Apart from his contributions to EUSA as Treasurer and his leadership in the EUSA strategy process, Lorenz Ursprung has also been regularly moderating panels at EUSA conferences and conventions, webinars and FISU-EUSA strategic dialogues.

PETER GEORGE

Peter George spent 39 years in international basketball: he refereed around 830 games in the German Basketball Bundesliga and officiated 145 European Cup games and 233 international matches as a FIBA referee.

George worked as a referee instructor and FIBA commissioner. He has also served for the German Basketball Federation's refereeing committee. He is known for his fair and consistent refereeing, as well as his dedication to the sport and his mentorship of younger referees.

Peter George took his first steps in European University Sports when he received, in 1991, a notice from the German Basketball Federation: a Professor from University of Hannover, Mr Enno Harms (later EUSA first President) was looking for help in developing basketball

university sport.

His first role in the EUSA European Universities Basketball Championship was its very first edition in 2001 in Aveiro, Portugal, together with Ulf Öhrmann from Sweden. They then worked together for many years in FIBA as referees and later as commissioners.

During one of his first EUSA European Universities Basketball Championship in Mulhouse, France, as one of his most fond memories, he met for the first time the leader of University of Ljubljana team, now EUSA Secretary General.

In 2012 he participated in the first EUSA Games and in 2023 he came full circle, being the Technical Delegate for the European Universities Basketball Championship 2023 in Aveiro, Portugal.

ZRINKO ČUSTONJA

Zrinko Čustonja is an Associate Professor at the University of Zagreb. He first became involved in university sports as a student, collaborating in the organization of university sports competitions at the University of Zagreb.

He assumed the role of President of the Croatian Academic Sports Federation (CASF) leading it for 16 years. During that period they organized the 3rd European Universities Games in Zagreb-Rijeka in 2016, 14 European Universities Championships in 17 sports, 2 World University Championships, the EUSA Conference and Convention (2015), the EUSA Symposium (2009), and 4 EUSA EC Meetings.

CASF now encompass over 20 sports and involves more than 20,000 student-athletes, becoming one of the largest sports systems in the

Republic of Croatia: within the national sports system, CASF is one of the five umbrella sports organizations explicitly recognized by the Croatian Sports Act. It is systematically supported politically, organizationally, and financially by the Ministry of Tourism and Sports of the Republic of Croatia and other state and political bodies.

CASF has built a reputable and recognizable position as a competent organizer and reliable partner, with its representatives holding positions in the highest bodies of FISU and EUSA. Zrinko Čustonja assembled a significant number of distinguished individuals who continue their dedicated work to enhance the university sports system.

He remains a staunch supporter and friend of university sports, both at the national and international levels.

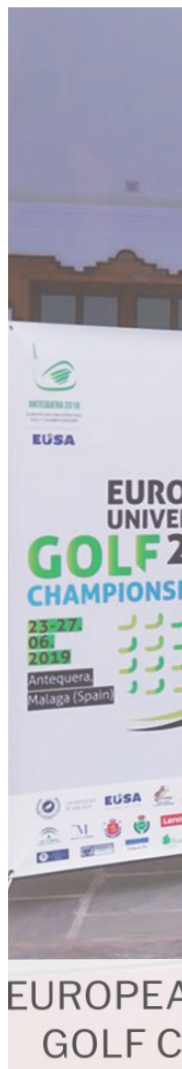
PEDRO MONTIEL GÁMEZ

Pedro Montiel Gámez is a professor at the Faculty of Education Sciences of the University of Malaga. He completed a degree in Physical Activity from the Polytechnic University of Madrid in 1986 and a Doctorate in Pedagogy in 1999 for which he received the Extraordinary Prize for Doctoral Theses I.A.D. He has been President of the National University Futsal Leagues, President of the University of Malaga Sports Club, Technical Director of the Sports Service and General Director of Sport at the University of Malaga, member of the Board of Directors of the LNFS and president of the Ethics Commission.

As organiser of international events, he has been President of 7 editions of the International Congress of Physical Activity for the Elderly, President of the

Organizing Committee of FISU World University Futsal (twice), Golf and Handball Championships, President of the Organizing Committee of EUSA European Universities Beach Volleyball, Handball, Futsal and Golf Championships.

Pedro Montiel recognitions include Extraordinary Prize for Doctoral Theses I.A.D., Bronze Medal to the Royal Order of Sports Merit, awarded by the Spanish Ministry of Education, Social Policy and Sport, AGESPORT Award (Andalusian Association of Sports Managers) as the best Sports Manager in Andalusia and Social Leadership Award of Malaga and Province.

KRZYSZTOF JÓŻWIK

Rector of Łódź University of Technology, since 2007 Director of the Institute of Turbomachinery, and for many years Vice-Rector for Education. He graduated from Łódź University of Technology in 1987 and subsequently defended his doctorate. He has been a professor since 2014. His research interests include mechanics and biomedical engineering.

He has researched blood flow in a project to build an artificial heart. He has also carried out scientific activities through work for Airbus Helicopters in the construction of an engine for the Eurocopter X3. Also, Prof. Jóźwik has conducted research on low-power wind turbines, a system for removing mercury from the exhaust gases of lignite-burning power units and methods for aerosol packaging disposal systems.

He is a co-author of 10 patents and 15 patent applications. He is the author and co-author of more than 170 scientific publications, and the manager of research projects implemented under Horizon Europe.

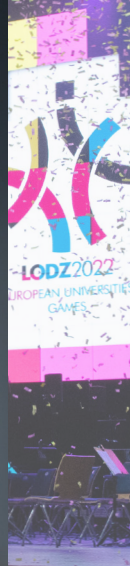
In 2007, he was appointed to the Management Board of Łódź Regional Science and Technology Park Sp. z o.o. as a Board Member. He held this position for 10 years.

Prof. Krzysztof Jóźwik is active in charity work within the Lions club, where he carries out numerous projects aimed at children. He is a keen cook and a great fan of tennis and volleyball. Prof. Krzysztof Jóźwik has received a number of awards for his scientific, organisational and charitable activities. The main ones are the Golden Cross of Merit and the Knight's Cross of the Order of Polonia Restituta.

LAURA CAPRANICA

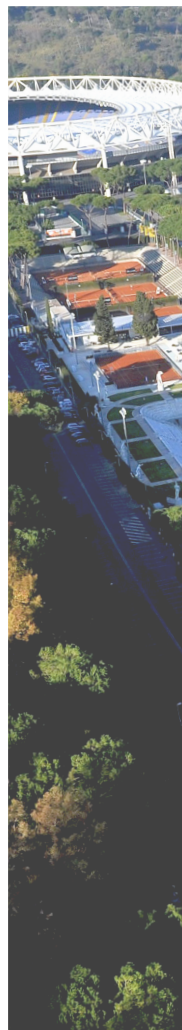
Prof. Laura Capranica is full Professor of Sport Sciences at the University of Rome Foro Italico, acting as President of the Master's Degree on Sport Coaching.

She is the President of the "European Student as Athlete" (EAS) Dual Career Network, collaborating with EUSA, the European Parliament, European Commission, and the Council of Europe on the European sport values and the rights of the sportspersons.

Prof. Capranica is Board Member of the Presidents of Italian Degrees in Sport Sciences, Visiting Professor in several European Universities under the Erasmus programme, Associate Editor of the Strength and Conditioning Research journal, and acts as a reviewer for several international journals.

Prof. Capranica authored more than 180 scientific papers and has given over 200 lectures and communications in national and international conferences and meetings.

She is an expert in identification of determinants (e.g., social, psychological, biological, organizational, and technical) for sport practice and performance in the lifespan; the development of the knowledge-based tools and resources needed to understand the effects of sport and exercise on human health; and the enhancement of bilateral translational links between laboratory and field evaluations performance.

The Badminton Europe Confederation (BEC) is the governing body for Badminton in Europe. It was founded in 1967 and is headquartered in Brøndby, Denmark.

BEC has 50 member associations and is responsible for organizing international badminton tournaments in Europe. BEC's mission is to promote and develop badminton throughout Europe. It does this by providing support to member associations, and developing badminton programs for all ages and abilities.

In 2014 an important Memorandum of Understanding was signed between EUSA and Badminton Europe – with the purpose to develop and improve organizational standards of the EUSA events and to popularize Badminton among European Universities.

The agreement should furthermore facilitate the development of collaboration between the two federations, BEC and EUSA, in the best interest of both parties.

Over the past 9 years the collaboration has blossomed, and the European Universities Badminton Championships as well as the Badminton competitions at the European Universities Games are delivered on a higher standard than ever before.

The appointed Technical Delegate for Badminton, Mr. Radomir Jovović, has together with EUSA and the various organizers managed to take the EUSA Badminton events to the next level, and the cooperation will hopefully continue to grow over the next many years – for the sake of EUSA and for the sake of Badminton.

In 2022 University Sports Association of Poland (AZS) had co-organized the European Universities Games in Łódź, in which 4459 participants, representing 422 universities from 37 countries in Europe took part. AZS was instrumental in coordinating over 800 volunteers, supporting participation of people with disabilities and hosting several educational activities. Thanks to the joined efforts of EUSA, AZS and the local Organising Committee, 285 participants from Ukraine were supported in being able to experience the biggest university sports event in Europe of the year.

AZS is the largest student organization in Poland, operating continuously for over 110 years. Numbers over 30,000 members associated with approximately 200 clubs and training in approx. 2500 sports sections. AZS athletes

are the stars of world sport and reach for the highest awards during the most prestigious events.

TÜRKIYE UNIVERSITY SPORTS FEDERATION

The Türkiye University Sports Federation (TUSF) was the proud organiser of European Universities Beach Volleyball Championship 2008 in Alanya, European Universities Football Championship 2011 in Istanbul, EUSA General Assembly 2014 in Denizli, European Universities Futsal Championship 2017 in Çorum, EUSA Executive Committee Meeting 2019 in Antalya, and 2022 in Istanbul.

The European University Rowing Championships 2022, organised in Istanbul and hosted by Yeditepe University, saw the participation of 534 participants, including 71 universities, 433 athletes, and 101 officials from 16 countries.

Türkiye, with a total of 49 medals, including 22 gold, 19 silver, and 8 bronze, ranked 2nd in the country standings of the European Universities Games 2022 in Łódź, Poland.

TUSF have also applied to host for the following upcoming events: European Universities Rowing Championships 2024 (Istanbul Technical University), European Universities Table Tennis Championships 2025 (Burdur Mehmet Akif Ersoy University), European Universities Orienteering Championships 2025 (Kastamonu University), European Universities Rugby 7s Championships 2025 (Middle East Technical University - Ihsan Dogramaci Bilkent University), European Universities Games 2028 (Manisa Celal Bayar University).

As of September 2023, in EUCs country rankings 2023, Türkiye is ranked 3rd with a total of 47 medals, including 14 gold, 7 silver, and 26 bronze medals.

DAVOR HABLJAK

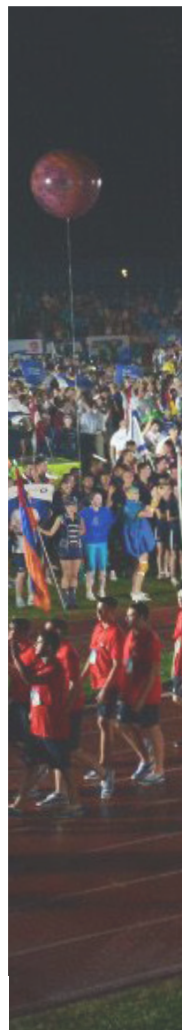

SELL STUDENT GAMES

SELL Games are organised by the national university sports associations in four founding countries: Finnish Student Sports Federation, Estonian Academic Sports Federation, Latvian University Sports Federation, Lithuanian Students' Sports Association. The event is held under the Patronage of EUSA and FISU.

The 38th edition of the SELL Student Games was hosted by the Estonian Academic Sports Federation and the city of Tartu, from 19-21 May marking the 100th Anniversary since this event started in 1923.

SELL Student Games is a multi-sport event that is open for all university and college students all over the world. The name of the games are according to the first letters of the hosting countries, Finland, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania in their respective languages.

The principles of the games are that everyone can participate and therefore the event combines top sports and joyful student event.

At this edition of the SELL games, 29 universities, coming from 6 different countries, took part in the competitions, having Estonia with the highest number of universities - 9, Lithuania and Latvia with 8, Finland with 2 and Croatia and Turkey with 1 university.

Students competed in 15 different disciplines – 3x3 basketball, mini-football, athletics, badminton, basketball, beach volleyball, chess, powerlifting, swimming, table tennis, volleyball, wrestling, disc golf, judo and orienteering.

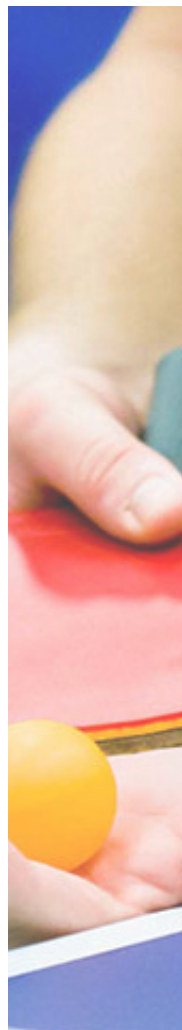
Matija Krnc was on the Olimpija Ljubljana team and was national Champion three times in former Yugoslavia. With the Yugoslavian team he participated in the World Championship in Ljubljana, winning a bronze medal. Krnc spent more than 40 years as a player and a coach in several clubs.

He has been featured in the Slovenian Table Tennis Association's special publications. His work was also featured in professional literature.

Krnc began his role as

organiser at the European Youth Championships in Bled in 1962, as technical support. Later, he provided technical support at the three World Championships that took place in former Yugoslavia. From 1991, Krnc participated annually in various positions in every international tournaments in Slovenia and as Deputy Referee at the World University Championships in 2006 in Maribor. Krnc is also involved in all Para Table Tennis tournaments in Slovenia.

Krnc has received numerous awards and recognitions for more than 60 years of volunteering in table tennis. In 2014, he was awarded the Rožanc Award, the highest award for volunteer work in sport in Ljubljana; 2017 he was awarded ETTU Badge of Honor and in 2018 Bloudek awards, the highest sport award in Slovenia.

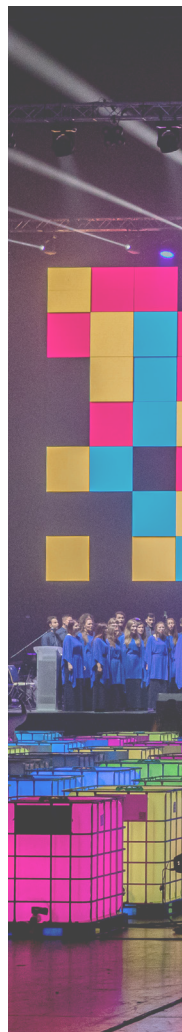

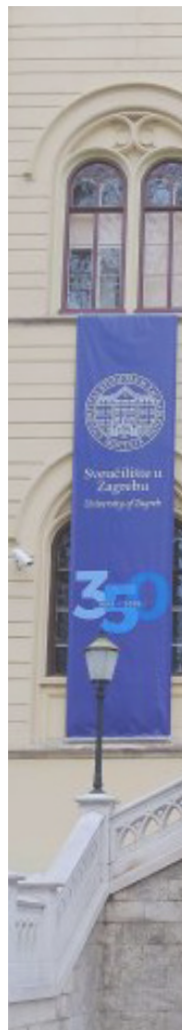

and 80 percent of scientific productivity of all Croatian universities.

With the basis they achieve at the local city championship, the students of the University of Zagreb are regularly the most successful in the country.

Top international sports results can be linked to the rise that has been going on since 2016, after the organization of the European Universities Games in Zagreb-Rijeka. Since then, the University of Zagreb has been declared the best European sports university three times so far (2016, 2019 and 2022).

UniSport Zagreb team organizes over 20 sports competitions for more than 5000 students every year.

Top international sports results can be linked to the rise that has been going on since 2016, after the organization of the European Universities Games in Zagreb-Rijeka. Since then, the University of Zagreb has been declared the Most Active university already twice - in 2019 and 2022.

With a guiding idea "Student as the focus of university development", the University of Zagreb will continue to invest in the development of student sports, thus encouraging the participation in and the organization of numerous EUSA competitions and other events.
