Welcome Address

Dear friends, the magazine you are reading is the annual review which celebrates our yearly activities.

This issue is particularly important because it is at the end of the Executive Committee's mandate which is going to see new elections in Maribor in 2012. Additionally, it marks the new milestone in EUSA publishing - after five years we have launched a new design and format of the EUSA Magazine.

What we have organised and experienced this year makes room to considerations on what has been achieved by our Association so far and gives the cue for reflection to the next 4 years of EUSA Governance.

The 2011 General Assembly in Eilat has given important indications for an EUSA which would meet the universities' requests through specific amendments of our rules as well as an Association which is close to the social and cultural changes of our Continent.

Our common work was already heading in this direction. Our partnership with other top level European entities for an European Union anti-doping project allowed us to be more present than the past not only in the sport activity but also in the social aspects linked to sport as demonstrated by our strong cooperation with the FISU Gender Committee.

In the meanwhile, our regular activity has increased the European Universities Championships to 16 and have registered the highest number of participants ever.

Moreover, Bosnia & Herzegovina and Finland contributed to EUSA with the organisation of respectively two EUC in Sarajevo and one in Tampere.

We can affirm that our visits to the local organisations (this year thanks to their NUSA's executives we have been hosted, for the first time, by the

political, sport and academic authorities of Georgia, Lichtenstein and Romania) demonstrated how appropriate was the decision taken by the EC to give particular attention to those countries with extraordinary potentials but are not as active yet.

Our ten years anniversary book carefully describes the activity from EUSA foundation, onwards. The book has been a great success and proved to be a very effective tool for the promotion of our movement.

2011 was also the year of the new FISU body election. We wish best of luck to the newly nominated President Mr Claude Gallien and to the EC Members for their future work. Our European members and partners are now fully engaged and devoted to the development of University Sport in Europe, focusing on current and future EUSA activities.

And the future is bright: 2012 is the year of the first EUSA Games in Cordoba while 2014 edition has been assigned to Rotterdam.

Big expectations arise from this event which is so important for our growth. Our Spanish friends are honouring the Games with a constant and efficient organisation as proved by His Majesty King Juan Carlos 1 of Spain chairing the Honorary Committee on this special occasion: there cannot be a better way to improve EUSA activity in the future, an Association which is in the service of the European University Sport.


2011 is another record-breaking year for EUSA and European University Sport in general. Not only a record-number of sixteen European Universities Championships was successfully organised throughout Europe but this year also witnessed a new record in terms of participation as 3630 students took part in our sporting competitions.

This huge increase since last year (2770 participants) is due to the greater number of championships (11 in 2010) and also to the increase in participation in eight of the championships.

If other evidences are needed to demonstrate the vitality of the university sports movement in Europe, just have a glance at the other figures for 2011: 15 different cities in 13 different countries hosted our events this year.

Regarding the geographic repartition of the participants, EUSA is also proud to announce that the previous mark has been beaten as participants from 35 member countries (and 2 guest countries, Luxemburg and Andorra) took part in at least one of the championships.

If we cast a closer look to each championship some changes happened this year.

Futsal, thanks to the hard communication work of the Organising Commit-

tee beat the record of the most popular EUC ever as never before the participation reached 500 participants in any of the events. Handball breaks into the top 5 events and saw the biggest increase since last year (+59%).

2nd European Universities Taekwondo Championship

Braga, Portugal: December 13-15, 2011



Intense matches

The 2nd European Universities Taekwondo Championship was held in Braga (POR) between December 13 and 15, 2011. The event was marked by the presence of prominent student athletes, among which we can highlight Portuguese students Rui Bragança (World Vice Champion), Nuno Pinto (World Top 20, World University medallist), Mário Silva (Vice Olympic Youth Champion), Jean Michel Fernandes (Junior Vice Champion), Ana Coelho (Silver medallist in Serbia Open, Female Athlete of the Year), Ana Rita Lopes (European University Vice Champion) and Eduardo Rodriguez (World University bronze medallist). Germany excelled with Konstantinos Konstantinidis (European Champion) and Sebastian Lehmann (European University medallist), while Russia had big names like Musikhina Ekaterina (Universiade bronze medallist), Kristina Khafizova (TOP 10 World) and Albert Gaaun (World University champion).

The sports event officially started with the opening ceremony on December 14, concluded the day later. With 40 universities from 16 countries participating, the championship was very successfull, especially since the event has been moved from initially planned location in Sofia. UMinho was organiser of this event for the second time, which is a result of fruitful cooperation with the Academic Association of the University of Minho (AAUM), the Academic

Federation of University Sports (FADU) under the aegis of the European University Sports Association (EUSA).

The event was attended also by distinguished authorities like the Rector of UMinho, Antonio Cunha, the EUSA President Alberto Gualtieri, President of FADU, Bruno Barracosa, the President of FPTaekwondo Jos Luis Sousa, the administrator of the SASUM, Carlos Silva, president of the AAUM, Lus Rodriguez, among others.

EUSA was represented at the championship by its President Mr Alberto Gualtieri and Chairman of the Medical Commission Mr Haris Pavletic and EUSA technical delegate for EUC Taekwondo 2011 Mr Joaquim Peixoto. The delegation was also received by the Rector of UMinho.

The Russian University of Physical Education, Sport and Tourism was undoubtedly the winner of the 2011 Taekwondo EUC, conquering 14 medals (10 golds, 1 silver and 3 bronzes), while the country with the most medals was Spain (15 medals), spread across seven universities.

With so many stars present, this event could only have a special glow, with a time of great athletes, competitions, social events and overall organisation for over 340 individuals directly involved in the championship - athletes, coaches, technical staff, organisers, volunteers, etc. Increase in participation proves that Taekwondo has a bright future in European university sport.

The next Taekwondo event within the EUSA sports programme is the 3rd European Universities Taekwondo Championship, to take place in Kazan, Russia, in 2013.






The competition took place in Ilidza Sports Centre, where also the Opening and the Closing Ceremonies were organised. The opening started with the march pass of the students athletes.

Mr Aitor Canibe Sanchez, EUSA Executive Committee member and Mrs Johanna St. Clair Renard, SAIF President, both also members of the EUSA Gender Equality Commission, presented the topic of women involvement in sport. More specifically, Mr Canibe Sanchez presented the current activities of the Gender Equality Working Group and the results of the questionnaire which was distributed among EUSA member federations. Mrs St. Clair Renard presented some examples of good practises of women participation and organisation in sport, pointing out opportunities

also for student sport. She concluded with an open question about the possibility of EUSA using women in sports as a catalyst for growth and development.

The conference, moderated by Mr Matjaz Pecovnik, EUSA Secretary General, was attended by the delegates and representatives of EUSA member federations, with invited guests also from FISU and Continental Organisations. We can especially point out the presence of Mr George Killian, FISU President, Mr Eric Saintrond, FISU Secretary General, Mr Ralethe Malumbethe, FASU President, and several FISU Executive Committee members.

The second day was entirely dedicated to the staging of the General Assembly itself.

At the General Assembly, representatives of 36 members - national university sport associations were present. Apart from the delegates and official representatives, the Assembly was also attended by the highest representatives of university sport with guests from the International University Sports Federation (FISU) and the Federation of African University Sports (FASU), representatives from the national and



local authorities, university rectors and other distinguished guests.

During the Opening session, the introductory speeches were given by Mr Meir Izahak Halevi, the Mayor of Eilat, Mr Uri Sheffer, the Head of Israel Sports Authority, Mr Mansour Abu Rashid, high general from Jordan and Mr George Killian, the President of FISU. The guest speakers were welcomed by Mr Arie Rosenzweig, President of ASA Israel and Mr Alberto Gualtieri, President of EUSA. Mr Gualtieri also expressed his gratefulness to the representatives of the member countries for participating in the assembly and

thanked the delegates and the guests for their presence and contributions at the Assembly and throughout the year.

The assembly was chaired by Mr Gualtieri. He presented the report of EUSA activity in 2010 on behalf of the Executive Committee. As the President of EUSA he also took this opportunity to thank the main partners and sponsors - FISU and Asiana Airlines - which are financially supporting EUSA, enabling it to grow and provide quality services and events to the member federations, Universities and students across Europe. Mr Matjaž Pečovnik, EUSA Secretary General presented the report on the past European Universities Championships, accompanied by statistics and datas.

Former EUSA Student Commission Chairwoman, Ms Eleftheria Kallikazarou gave a report on the activities of the STC in the previous year, with emphasis on the Volunteer Programme and the Photo Competition Award.

An interesting discussion followed about the inclusion of students in the EUSA Executive Committee as a result of another proposal of statutes modification. During the discussion, the latter motion was withdrawn, and its concept and intention was added to the Activity Plan of EUSA for the current year.

The delegates then approved the reports of the Executive Committee, Student Commission, Annual Accounts, modifications of the statutes, activity programme and provisional budget 2012.

The Assembly concluded by the presentation of the EUSA Assembly 2012 by Mr Otmar Kugovnik, EUSA EC member and the President of the Slovenian University Sports Association. He invited all the delegates and the guests to come to Maribor in March 2012 for the next EUSA Assembly, and as Maribor is the venue of the next Winter Universiade, Mr Kugovnik also expressed his hope to welcome all EUSA member federations there. At the end, EUSA President Mr Gualtieri warmly thanked Mr Arie Rosenzweig for hosting the Assembly.

European Anti-Doping Initiative



EUSA is one of the key partners in the project European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn), which started in 2010, and will conclude in 2012. The project is aimed at establishing an European-wide Anti-Doping mentality in the youth sector by establishing a moral tenor towards concepts such as Fair-play, sensitizing and raising awareness on all levels of the complex social environment surrounding the doping problematic and implementing strategies to motivate young people to pass on the message and create a strong multiplying effect. The emphasis is on a peer-to-peer network of Anti Doping Junior Ambassadors.

Key promoters are young ambassadors, selected from all over Europe. EUSA nominated five ambassadors - Aikaterini Zompanaki (GRE), Luka Rukavina (CRO), Andre Bonello (MLT), Jan Družina (SLO), Tjaša Hojnik (SLO) and Marko Zunić (CRO) as the group coordinator. Together with Mrs Abosede Ajayi (GBR) as EUSA representative - Medical commission member they attended the Anti-Doping Junior Ambassador Camp, held in Kirchdorf near Burghausen, Germany in June 2011.

A priority at the ADJA Camp was to sensitize the Junior Ambassadors towards the doping problematic and to enable them to reflect about their personal situation and their attitude on doping. Different training tools have been used - group work, presentation, discussions, etc. The Camp received very positive feedback with our ambassadors who also continue their work in their national university sports associations.

Several activities have been carried out within the framework of this project. Let's take a look at some of them. As an on-going effort, information has been published online at the EUSA website and at our social media networks, in the newsletters and in the magazine. The promotion continued in the media channels of participating ambassadors' national university sport federations. Information about Anti-Doping and EADIn project was provided during the European Universities Championships by speaking about the subject matter and including the topic in the information bulletins and websites. EUSA Medical and Student Commission use the results of the project in their agenda and plans for future activities.

Our ambassadors were active during EUSA events, and in their home countries - especially with their National University Sport Associations. Lectures and workshops have been carried out in Croatia, Greece, Malta and Slovenia, as well as other activities carried out by the ambassadors and their federations.

EADIn Final Conference entitled EADInn Bridge will take place during the 1st Youth Olympic Games in Innsbruck, Austria: January 13–17, 2012. In March 2012, the results of the project will also be presented at the EUSA Conference in Maribor, Slovenia, preceding the General Assembly of our association. The activities will continue also at the 1st European Universities Games this July in Cordoba, Spain.

The European Anti-Doping Initiative is funded by the EU programme Prepara-

tory Action in the field of sport, and promotes healthy sports participation, without drugs.





EUSA junior anti-doping ambassadors

Interview with Jan Družina and Aikaterini Zompanaki, EUSA anti-doping ambassadors

We have met with Kate & Jan to discuss their experiences as EUSA Junior Ambassadors in the project of European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn).

Can you briefly introduce yourselves?

Kate: 1 am from Greece and 1 just turned 24. 1 am a student of the National Technical University of Athens, at the department of Rural and Surveying Engineering. Apart from the studies, 1 also play volleyball and -my personal favourite- beach volleyball. 1 have also challenged my skills from time to time in other sports, like sailing, curling, football, tennis, etc.

Jan: I'm 20 years old and I come from a small town called Logatec in Slovenia. Since my childhood I've played only one sport and I'm still doing it: Ski jumping. I've practiced this sport for 15 years now and my personal best is 187 meters in Planica this year. I'm also studying sports at the University of Ljubljana, which I really find interesting. I am also involved in University Sport, and I'm helping there as much as I can.

How did you learn about this project and how did you get involved in it?

Kate: 1 am a member of EUSA's Student Commission and 1 am really enjoying my work there. This is how 1 learned about the Anti-Doping Junior Ambassadors project, when they nominated me to participate on their behalf, to be trained and pass on the message of the anti-doping mentality to both them and to all the young athletes participating at the EUSA's sports tournaments.

Jan: During my studies I've noticed the call on the Slovenian University Sports Association's website to become an Anti-Doping Junior Ambassador. I really liked the topic, so I applied. When the results came out, I was thrilled to see my name on it. The next step was training and education about



doping. Five ambassadors from EUSA went to a camp in Burghausen in Germany. There were around 50 ambassadors from 9 different associations, coming from all over Europe.

Can you tell us more about the training camp?

Kate: We were trained by interesting people, who deal with doping on professional basis and we met people affected by it as well. This way we were able to build on our anti-doping mentality and adopt fair-play as a way of everyday life. And we actually realized that the game that we adore so much is in fast ruined with all those supplements. During the training, we had the opportunity to debate, to get informed, to guide our mentality and to bond with each other, embrace new cultures and habits. I did have the chance of meeting really interesting people, even to make friends and have a really great time with them in Germany.

Jan: Camp was really exciting. I've met a lot of interesting people from all around Europe. We had a busy schedule with activities pretty much all day. During the educational program we've learned more about doping, and we also got some advices about passing this information to younger sportsmen, sportswomen and their coaches. Between every lecture, we had teambuilding games so we could also trust each other and work as a team. In the evening, we had introductions about every country and association. And of course, we also had some parties. Everybody liked staying there, and we can't wait to visit Innsbruck in January 2012 for the final conference during the 1st Winter Youth Olympic Games.



So now that you are an "Anti-Doping Junior Ambassador", what do you do and what are the next steps?

Kate: This training as an Anti-Doping Junior Ambassador has been of a great evolvement to me. After consultation with my national university sport federation - EATE, we conducted a miniseminar in the Athletics department of the National Technical University of Athens as well as a briefing of the participants of the annual University Panellenic Tournament. I have already passed on the message of the Anti-Doping mentality to my STC colleagues and we are planning on passing the knowledge on to students, both friends, athletes in our home countries and participants of the EUSA's sports tournaments.

Jan: In the field of university sport, we prepared some promotion and activities in printed and electronic media, and we carried additional promotion during the EUC Golf. I also joined other Slovenian ambassadors with Olympic Committee of Slovenia. We already did a lot of promotion - we had lectures for Slovenian European Youth Olympic Festival Team and also Junior Olympic Team. We were also part of world championships in rowing, that took place in Slovenia. Next, we will have lectures and workshops for high schools with sports classes and faculty of sport students about doping. I plan to continue this noble mission also after the final conference in Innsbruck, being active both under EUSA and the Slovenian Olympic Committee.

Thanks Kate and Jan for your work, and good luck with spreading positive impacts of sport!

Social Responsibility Program

EUSA, as a European Sports Association, already promotes a strong and good message across young people, mostly students, all across Europe. However, this social group is subject to a group of issues, widely and long ago identified, that should be addressed in 2011, the Student Commission therefore launched a Social Responsibility Program, which comprises the areas: Promoting healthy lifestyles through sport, food habits, excessive alcohol

Interview: Rafael Slon

Rafal took part in the 6th European Universities Handball Championship in Rijeka, Croatia. He told us more about his involvement in the championship and in University Sports.

Can you briefly introduce yourself?

My name is Rafal Slon and I come from Kielce, Poland. I'm 22 years old and I'm studying at the Cracow University of Economics. My specialization is Tourism and Recreation at Faculty of Management. I am an active handball player and also a board member of University Sports Association at my university. I'm interested in geography, politics, and above all – sports. I also love to play football and tennis.

How did you learn about the European Universities Championships and about the volunteer program?

My colleague, Darius, was a volunteer few years ago during European Universities Table Tennis Championship in Italy. He told me this is a great opportunity to make new, interesting friendships with people from all around Europe. Soon after that I visited the EUSA website and read information about the volunteering program. Then I prepared my profile and waited until the time comes to apply for championships.

Why did you decide to apply as a volunteer?

How can be decision any different when you consider words: July – Croatia – Handball – Adriatic Sea – Partying, together in one sentence? I don't think anyone would hesitate. For me it is all about great atmosphere and people that you meet. The next thing is that I wanted to check my orginizing skills during larger event than Polish Universities Championships, comprehend how it works, and than perhaps implement some ideas and solutions to our national championships.

I also had great fun, especially in the evenings, with guys from Kalisz and Katowice, and of course with girls from Lublin.

What did you do on this event?

I was given the function of attaché of the University of Vincent Pol from Lublin, Poland. It means that I spent most of the time with girls from the team and team officials. I was responsible for communication between my team and organizers. Everyday I had to check at Info Point, if there is any information left for me and my team and then go with ladies to watch their games. Several times a day I spoke to team officials about their needs and schedule and I was also responsible for booking the gym and sport hall for trainings, as well as many other things that occurred during the day. To sum up I have to say that my days were a bit busy, but I really enjoyed being helpful for my team.

Interview: Marika Miller

Marika comes from Poland and she's a very experienced volunteer, her last trip: Kragujevac for the 2011 European Universities Volleyball Championship.

Can you briefly introduce yourself?

I'm Marika Miller. I come from Poland. My hometown is Częstochowa but I now live in Warsaw. I am doing 1st year of master programme in international relations at Warsaw University and working in Cubiware, an IT company, as office assistant. I love sport. I used to play volleyball. I like also swimming, fitness and table-tennis. I also love travelling! New places, new architecture, new people something amazing!

How did you learn about the European Universities Championships and about the volunteer program?

My adventure with European University Championships started when my friends from high school won the Polish Volleyball University Championship and they told me that they would represent our country at the EUC in Warsaw [2010], so i decided to take part in this event, to be the part by helping organisers. I wrote to AZS, they answered that they needed help, so I worked at the event as Polish team assistant. What are the good points of being a volunteer on EUC?

Good points. Well, first of all- learning how to be independent, how to fight with stress, involving languages that is very useful in your future. Of course meeting new people who you know for all your life (last year after the EUC I went to Belgium to visit friends I met at the championship). Gender Equality in University Sports

This article deals with a study implemented by EUSA in collaboration with FISU and the EUSA member federations on the question of "Women and Sports" on the European scale.

It shows that EUSA's involvement is and will remain fundamental as a sports structure responsible for presenting lines of action and work adopting the criterion of Gender Equality as one of the main objectives to be reached.

At the same time, in our national and international federations, we must take account of the real needs of our university students by defining guidelines and actions that increase and improve our practice in this field.

Consequently, the points of interest mentioned by the Council of Europe and its recommendations on physical exercise and sports in university circles are particularly pertinent.

Not only from the standpoint of the practice of sports, but also in terms of better representation of women in decision-taking and organizational positions at national and European levels.

The Gender Equality working group at EUSA was created in 2009 and Mr Aitor Canibe Sánchez, Head of the University Sports Department in Spain (Higher Sports Council) and also a member of the EUSA Executive Committee, has been appointed to head the group.

Mrs Johanna St. Clair Renard, Chairwoman of the Swedish University Sports Federation, works with this group to study and review potential actions and projects that could be implemented in the short and medium term.

We all know that studies on the participation of women in the University world are rare, be they national or international.

This is true not only with regard to the participation of women, but also for their presence in decision taking and organizational functions...

Within EUSA, we consider that under these circumstances improving knowledge of the real situation in our universities and federations is a priority. The presentation of this study will help us know more about the policies and strategies currently used by

the member countries of EUSA and to analyze them.

The obtained data gives us better grounds for tackling and estimating the reality of university sports, not only in quantitative terms, but also and essentially from the perspective of the quality and variety of programmes related to gender equality.

What is more, we can then orient our work on the basis of the experience of each country, and we will have a better understanding of needs and can reinforce the measures adopted by each country in this field.

The EUSA committee has determined the following priorities: Participation of women as athletes nationally and internationally; Roles as leaders (women at the head of university sports departments and national university sports federations); Attentively taking account of projects and initiatives carried out by national federations and universities to promote Gender Equality through sports.

Concept of the Study

After analysing the priority aspects to be considered in the study, we sent a document line on to 43 EUSA member countries.

18 countries had answered (41.86%) by 3 March 2011, the deadline for receiving responses.

Questionnaires were completed by Austria, Belarus, Bulgaria, Croatia, France, Germany, Greece, Lithuania, Montenegro, Portugal, Moldova, FYR Macedonia, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and Turkey. The final report was presented at the EUSA General Assembly in Eilat (Israel) on 4 March 2011; this issue of EUSA Magazine includes a summary of the final results drawn from the information transmitted and experience shared by participating countries.

Universities and Students


Although at first sight, this information does not seem pertinent, we realize that the percentage of private universities (43.8%) in Europe is close to that of public universities (56.2%), which is an extremely important aspect to define guidelines for our work on the theme Women and Sports.

The type of university will point to the kind of strategy we can implement to obtain more satisfactory results.


Do public and private universities have the same strategic objectives and policies?

Given the great variety that exists today, we should think in terms of effective coordination between the various universities, the national and continental federations, and FISU so we can move forward and make progress in the practice of physical activity and sports.

For the 16 countries that answered this question, 46% of students are female and 54% are male.



Repartition between male and female students



University Sport Participation at National Level

12 countries answered the question about the participation of university students in activities in each of the countries at various levels. The responses showed that most important aspect to be stressed is an increase in participation of women by 10% over a period of two years (2008-2010).

Although these figures can cloud gaps that may be hard to estimate, we should still give positive reinforcement to the tendency for improvement of practice of sports by female university students in Europe.



NUSAs Actions with Gender Equality as priority objective

One of the most important aspects of this study deals with the knowledge of the projects and initiatives of national federations and universities to promote Gender Equality through sports.

Based on the responses obtained, we must realize that this subject needs considerable work for all the associations, all the federations and all the universities both to develop an ambitious programme in terms of practice and to consolidate the presence of women in positions for policy making, management, technical officials, ...

Two National University Sports Associations (12,5%) are Organising Educational Events Specially for Women and 5 (38,5%) are Nominating Woment to Different Positions, 3 (20%) are conducting other actions.

Among these three, Portugal and Spain gave example of good practices.

PORTUGAL

They collaborate with the Portuguese Women and Sports Association to promote actions: "Driving Other Challenges" Female Coaches project – In October, 2010, they participated in a seminar where they presented the conclusion of this study. "The Girls Game" project in which they organize an action with National University Female Futsal Team.

SPRIN

They work with the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Gender Equality:

Spanish University Merit Award for Women and Sports among the universities.

Two items are assessed:

- Participation in Spanish University Championships
- Projects and initiatives to promote gender equality through sports


Gender repartition among Directors of Academic Sport Services at Universities

How can international federations like EUSA, and FISU, etc. take action within universities that are fully independent and have the power to define their own general policies, particularly those dealing with sports?

The graph shows that for the 12 countries that answered this question, 78% of the persons responsible for university sports departments are men and 22% are women.

It should also be underlined that the percentage female presence is higher in certain countries like Lithuania (50%), Slovenia (41%) and Sweden (38%).

In addition, in Austria, Croatia, Serbia and Switzerland, no positions of high responsibility for sports questions in universities are occupied by women.



Participation at International Competitions

Students

The purpose of this question is to know more about participation of athletes and official representatives in events organized by FISU (World University Championships and Winter and Summer Universiades).

There are many aspects to be taken into account on this point, since the selection of national representatives differs for each of the countries varies with regard to participation in these championships.


Universities, sports federations for each of the disciplines, the Ministry of Sports ... are bodies that have a greater or lesser influence depending on the countries.

As concerns participation of athletes, 14 countries answered and indicated that at the World University Championships in 2010, participation of women was 39.56% while for the Universiades 2011, the percentage was slightly lower.

For participation broken down by country, 6 exceeded 40% (Sweden, Germany, Turkey, Spain, France and Slovenia) and only three countries show participation of less than 30%.

European Universities Championships

For the data obtained on participation in various Universiades and countries present at the European Championships organized by EUSA for the years 2009 and 2010, the important conclusions below can be drawn:

Participation of women athletes increased by 5% (from 33% to 38%) even in 2010, when there were 4 fewer disciplines than in 2009. EUSA has managed to see that competitions for all disciplines include both male and female participation.

The presence of women as official representatives dropped by 4% (from 21% to 17%) although the fact that competitions in badminton, bridge, golf and karate were not organized may have had an indirect influence here.

On comparing the data for European championships with those indicated previously for the presence of women in FISU events, it can be observed that the percentages of athletes and of official representatives are very similar.

Conclusion & Recommendationss

There are a number of specific proposals from countries that answered the survey.

We are listing some of them here, focusing on what to do in the future for EUSA and for University Sports in general, it is the really important point.

- A more diversified and inclusive sports system
- Always promote the same competitive sport with both genders

- Guidelines for the NUSF
- Different Fee for Women's competition
- Female Educational Programmes
- Promote more female volunteering
- During competition, organize workshops that include women and sports (with themes about women as athletes, managers or coaches)
- Joint projects with FISU
- Involve women's sports in the EUSA competition schedule. For example Rhythmic Gymnastic, Swimming, Aerobic...
- Strive to involve more women at all levels in organization.

As far as EUSA is directly concerned, some actions can and are being carried out, following this study:

- Carry out equality impact assessments for all our policies, programmes and projects
- · Encourage equal opportunities for all members
- Publish the program on our website ...and social media channels), setting out the priority actions and goals to be achieved.






Women's competition EUC Basketball


2009 EUC Athletes Participation




2010 EUC Athletes Participation

Prevention of Sexualized Violence in Sports

Impulses for an open, secure and sound sporting environment in Europe

After successfully taking part in the Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn), EUSA will again shows its dedication to improve the sporting environment for students by participating in a new project funded by the European Commission under the "Preparatory Action in the field of sport" program.

It is no news that sports and physical activity are extremely important for the European social environment. They increase social interaction and offer numerous possibilities for non-formal education and inclusion.

Sporting environments are places of intense physical, social and emotional interaction between homogenous as well as intergenerational groups of people. Due to this nature, young sportsmen and sportswomen are vulnerable to sexual discrimination, harassment and abuse, which might have heavy impacts on the physical and psychological health of its victims.

All types of sports and every level of performance might be subject to this problem and although the organized sport sector is striving to develop preventive measures on sexual harassment and abuse, sports organizations often find themselves facing new challenges and difficulties in their fight.

The project will have for goal to overcome the lack of a consistent European framework on the prevention of sexual harassment.

This European-wide framework could play a part in contributing to:

- sensitise athletes, trainers and officials in sports structures throughout Europe on the topic of sexual harassment and abuse in sports
- strengthen international cooperation and networking between experts and counselling centres as well as relevant social groups and organisations in their efforts to prevent sexual harassment and abuse in sports
- create a sound foundation for the methodical elicitation of relevant data to capture the dimension of sexual harassment and abuse in sports
- compile impulses and recommendations for action on the topic of prevention of sexual harassment and abuse in sports for a European sports policy

The leading organisation will create a network of European experts on the topic of prevention of sexual harassment and abuse in sports. These experts will engage in an exchange on good practices and will create a guidance and catalogue of recommendations for actions.

The role of EUSA within the project will be, through a contact person, to distribute, publicize and make available all information generated through the project to their member organizations. It will also publicize the call for participation for the planned European conference.

The project is leaded by German Olympic Sports Confederation and its youth organisation, the German Sports Youth.

Activities of EUSA Member Federations

NUSAs to improve the sporting environment for students

EUSA and its members have been focusing since the last few years on the place of women in university sports. Thus, in February, the Finnish Student Sports Federation (OLL) became the first student sports organisation in the world to sign the Birghton Declaration. The overriding aim is to develop a sporting culture that enables and values the full involvement of women in every aspect of sport. It was followed by the British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) who announced its intention to sign the declaration.

EUSA itself followed the path of its two members and at the last Executive Committee meeting decided to sign the declaration.

Among other concerns, EUSA and its members are strongly involved in the prevention and fight against doping. This year, the French University Sport Federation (FFSU) thanks to Dr. Questel, doctor of the Federation, set up a very innovative method to detect cannabis consumption among athletes. Trials were made, in a purely preventive

and informative goal, with the French team during the Shenzhen Universiades. Out of more than 100 tested athletes, one was found positive.

This successful initiative has been acknowledged by the European Union at the European Actions on Drugs in Warsaw. It is hoped that this program will be extended to smaller scale events as an effective way to fight against cannabis consumption.

EUSA continues its visits to developing members

Willing to improve the participation of all its members in its events, EUSA is visiting its less active members in order to help their development. First visit in 2011 was paid in April to Romania, where EUSA President and Secretary General met representatives of the University Sports Federation of Romania, Ministry of sports and the National Olympic Committee. During the meeting with representatives of the Romanian University Sports Federation, Mr. Gualtieri congratulated Mrs Georgescu for her recent nomination on the position of Secretary General and he ensured her that EUSA will support the NUSA in all its efforts to further develop the university sport in the country.

State Secretary for Youth and Sport, Mrs Melinte, met EUSA representatives and promised that they "will cooperate with the national university sports federation to further develop the university sports in the country". Mr Gualtieri thanked her for her shown affection to the university sport.

The Rector of the National University of Physical Education and Sport, prof. dr. Viorel Cojocaru, awarded Mr Gualtieri, with Doctor Honoris Causa, a honorary doctorate for his extraordinary achievements in the field of university sports.

In September, EUSA President, Secretary General and Treasurer went for

a very special visit on the invitation of the University Sports Federation of Liechtenstein (USFL), who has recently applied for EUSA membership. EUSA representatives were welcome by Mr Gregor Diehr, USLF President and Mrs Verena Burtscher, Secretary General, together with Mr. Jakob Buchel, Preisdent of Sports Commission of Liechtenstein and Mr Stefano Nascher, Head of the Office of Sports of Liechtenstein.

The recently established federation, who will become the 44th member of EUSA, presented its structure and activities. It will strive to promote the synergies between studies and competitive sport, to ensure the participation of Lichtenstein to international competition, to develop national university sport competitions and to provide adequate structures for and between universities.

Last visit this year was conducted by EUSA President and Secretary General to Georgia. Being one of the most recent members, the University Sports Federation of Georgia (USFG) has started to send university teams to EUSA events for the first time this year.

Meeting with Georgian Olympic Committee (GOC) President, Mr Gia Natshlishvili, was fruitful and the cooperation between both organisation was praised by GOC President: "Both federation support each other. Georgia will organise the Olympic Youth Festival in 2015; and USFG will be an important partner." Possibility for USFG to host a European Universities Championship in the future was also discussed.

General Assemblies

In March, the Hungarian University Sport Federation (HUSF) held its General Assembly, significant changes were brought in the structure of the federation. The Executive Board has been reduced from 21 to 15 members and the work of the president, Dr. Tamás Sárközy, newly elected, is now supported by 3 vice-presidents, Dr. Pál Vincze, Dr. Lajos Besenyei and Dr. László Honfi. The continuity of the work of the HUSF is provided by HUSF headquarters led by Secretary General Dr. Csaba Hédi.

April saw the Swiss University Sports Federation (SHSV/FSSU) holding its General Assembly at the House of Sports in Ittigen, Berne, the Headquarters of the Swiss Olympic Association. Annual report of SUSF President Mr. Andreas Csonka was approved and a new treasurer, Mr. Stefan Schneider, was elected after the retirement of Mr. Olaf Frost.

The General Assembly acknowledged the participation of Swiss teams in international events in 2010 as "very successful."

The Italian University Sport Federation (CUSI) held its elective General Assembly in May, in the city of Cagliari. Mr. Leonardo Coiana, after presenting the annual report, was entrusted another mandate as president for the 2011–2014 period. Awards and recognitions were presenting during the assembly.

One of the last General Assemblies held in 2011 was the one organised by the Finnish Student Sport Federation (OLL) at Vierumki Sports Institute in early November. Lotte Uutinen, 24 years old nursery student, has been chosen to lead the federation next year. The new vice presidents are Saila Huhtiranta and Silva Loikkanen.

In December, the General Assembly with a special celebration honouring best individuals and teams was also organised in Zagreb, Croatia. CUSF President Mr Zrinko Custonja, Vice-President Mr Haris Pavletic and Secretary General Mr Ronald Strumberger met EUSA representatives and together they attended a meeting at the University of Zagreb with the Rector prof. dr. Aleksa Bjelis.

Various

A very interesting initiative was taken by the Portuguese University Sports Federation (FADU). In order to build a new image, FADU got a new logo designed. This logo is aimed to become the true visual identity of the federation by being used as a global logo but also specifically for each sport (see pictures) and as a marketing tool fulfilling the federation's various needs (t-shirts, business cards, etc.). The new flexible logo keeps the U shape of University Sports and conveys all values shared by University Sports fans.

Celebrations and Galas

In February, the Finnish Student Sports Federation (OLL) celebrated its 87th anniversary in various ways. Highlights of Finnish performances at the 25th Winter Universiade in Erzurum were shown with a strong emphasize on the Rockettes and Marigold IceUnity who had a double victory in synchronized skating and on the women's ice hockey team who pocketed very respectable silver medals.

The Finnish Student Athlete of the year award was also given as a part of the celebration. For the fifth year in a row, it went to a female athlete, Pauliina Frilander, who won gold medal in 50 metres rifle prone in World University Sport Shooting Championship in 2010.

As far as Nordic countries are concerned, it is worth noticing that the Swedish University Sports Federation is feverishly preparing for its 100th anniversary, in 2013, which will be commemorated by a number of activities and events during the entire year. Most important ones will be the hosting of the 2013 FISU rectors' forum, in Umea, and the 2013 European Universities Badminton Championship in Uppsala.

Winter Universiade brought new permanent landmarks to Erzurum

Top student athletes from all around the world gathered twice in 2011 to take part in the largest university sports events – Summer and Winter Universiades. The 25th Winter Universiade was held between January 27 and February 6, 2011 in Erzurum, Turkey. It noted a record participation – almost 2,500 participants from 52 countries were present at this edition of the FISU Winter Games. The organisers did an excellent job, especially regarding the accommodation, facilities and hospitality. Almost 300 members of press and media made sure that the news, images and video was of this largest winter university event was distributed throughout the world.

The 26th Summer Universiade, organised in Shenthen, China between August 12 and 23, was also a ground-breaking one. Over 10,600 participants from 151 countries, representing over 7,100 ath-





letes and 3,400 officials took part in this year's edition of the largest university sport event in the world. The organisers prepared competitions in 24 sports. FISU Conference was organised during the Universiade with the theme University Sport: From Culture of the "How" to Culture of the "Why". Young Reporters Program was carried out, and several cultural and social activities were organised during the games as well.

Next universides will be in 2013 in Maribor (Winter), Kazan (Summer) and in 2015 in Granada (Winter) and Gwangju (Summer).

General Assembly and Elections

The 32nd General Assembly of FISU was held on August 9 and 10 in Shenzhen, China. The Assembly was a prelude to the 26th Summer Universiade which was hosted in the same city. Agenda of the assembly included report of the activities and projects in the past period, confirmation of new members and election of the new board. FISU family now counts 163 national university sports organisations around the world. FISU Member Associations also

elected the new Executive Committee, chaired by Mr Claude-Louis Gallien, former 1st Vice-President of FISU. Mr Killian was named honorary president for his past efforts and achievements.

28 World University Championships in 2012

As 2012 approaches, FISU is getting ready for the World University Championships to be organized next year. In four months the first WUC 2012 will start launching the campaign. Indeed, 28 championships will be hosted on 26 different cities from 17 countries on 5 continents from January to Decem-

ber 2012. Three sports will figure for the first time in the program of the FISU World University Championships, namely 3-on-3 Basketball, Netball and Long Track Speed Skating which will take place respectively in Kragujevac (SRB), Cape Town (RSA) and Zakopane (POL). As every two years, the

World University Championships will be an opportunity for top athletes studying all around the world to gather and compete together in a high level competition devoted to those who combine sport performance and intellectual excellence.

2017 Universiades Bidding and Attribution

After the 2017 candidate cities delivered their bid book to the FISU President on September 30th, the Evaluations Committees for the Winter and Summer Universiades traveled to the 2017 Bidding Cities during the months of October and November for their inspection visits. During their trips the FISU delegates met with the highest authorities.

In Tapei City the SU Evaluation Committee delegates met with Mayor

Lung-Bin HAU, the Minister of Education, Mr. Ching-Ji WU and the Director of the Sports Affairs Council, Mr.Rey CHOU. They also had a meeting with the President of Chinese Taipei MA Ying-Jeou. In Brasilia they met with the Minister of Education Fernando Haddad and were received by the Chief Minister of the Presidential Secretariat of the Brazil Republic, Gilberto Carvalho as well as by the Governor of the Federal District Agnelo Queiroz and the Minister of Sport Aldo Rebelo.

In Almaty the WU Evaluation Committee delegates encountered Akhmetzhan Essimov, Mayor of Almaty. In Astana they had a meeting with the Prime Minister of the Republic of Kazakhstan Karim Massimov, Minister of Education and Science Bakhytzhan Zhumagulov and Minister of Tourism and Sports Talgat Ermegiyayev. In Trentino they met with City Mayor Alessandro Andreatta and the Provincial Councilors Tiziano Mellarini and Marta Dalmaso. Unfortunately, Trentino withdrew its bid one week before the actual attribution.

FISU was informed by the President of the Bidding Committee, Manuela





Di Centa who said that the Provincial Council of the Autonomous Province of Trento, in accordance with the Bidding Committee, had decided to abandon the candidacy for the Winter Universiade 2017. The reason of withdrawal has to be found in the dire economic situation Italy finds itself in. 'Due to the particular moment and to the particular economic context, the Council has considered it non convenient to proceed with the candidacy, in consideration of the high financial commitment required by the Organization', Mrs. Di Centa explained in her communication.

On November 29th, after the bidding cities gave their final presentations in Brussels, the FISU Executive Committee attributed the 2017 Universiades to Almaty, Kazakhstan (Winter) and Taipei City, Chinese Taipei (Summer).

The participants will have a firsthand opportunity to visit the Island which is known as having been a slavery hub. The location of Dakar at the shores of the Atlantic Ocean is another reason why the African University Students will have a blast during the 6th All Africa University Games.

NBA Africa to support FASU Games 2012 and to become a strategic partner

During the Basketball without Boarders-Africa clinic held in Johannesburg, South Africa, on 2nd September 2011, FASU held discussions with NBA legends and Officials from top NBA Clubs on the possible collaborations in the development of University Basketball in Africa to a better competitive level at the world stage.

The NBA Global Ambassador, Dr. Congo born Dikembe Mutombo lead a contingent of NBA legends including Dee Brown, Patrick Ewing, Jeff Hornacek, Alonzo Mourning and Bo Outlaw and the WNBA legends Tamika Raymond and Edna Campbell.

The NBA legends pledged to support the efforts of FASU in promoting University basketball on the continent of Africa, by advocating for inter-development programs between FASU and their various clubs.

In his words, the FASU president expressed his joy at the interest the top basketball clubs and players showed towards the development of the sport at the University level on the continent of Africa. He assured them of consistent support and collaboration towards the promotion of sport, since some of their top recruits may be a product of University Basketball.

In a related development, FASU represented by President Dr. Ralethe Michael Malumbete, the 1st Vice President Mr. Leopold Senghor and the Secretary General Mrs. Peninnah Aligawesa Kabenge met with the Vice President of the NBA-Africa Mr. Amadou Fall at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Johannesburg, South Africa. The meeting aimed at formalizing a working relationship with NBA Africa that will help the two parties develop sport together on the African Continent.



NBA will use the already existing structures within FASU as a vehicle for sustainable development. Regional seminars and competitions will be organized towards a continental university basketball Championship or league. It was confirmed that NBA Africa will play a big role in the basketball games in the 6th All Africa University Games scheduled to take place in Dakar Senegal in September 2012.

The 2011 FISU-Oceania General Assembly also confirmed the appointments to the OUSA Executive and to commence the FISU-OUSA Strategic Planning process for the next FISU mandate period and some very bold steps to ensure that the Continental Association fulfils the role FISU envisages for it and also best serve the Oceania member countries of FISU.

During this assembly a new OUSA member, New Caledonia, was welcome in the association.

The FISU-Oceania members would like to pay tribute to the sterling efforts of OUSA President Karen Nelson who resigned her role on 28th June 2011 due to family circumstances. Congratulations also to Mr Ray Preston (Cook Islands) who stepped so seamlessly into the void left by Mrs Nelson and was installed as OUSA President for the remainder of this current mandate (till 2014).

OUSA Projects

OUSA with the support of Papua New Guinea University Sports Association and Australian University Sport, delivered an Event Management and Team Leadership workshop for 50 students and University sport managers at the University of Technology, Lae Papua New Guinea as the pilot to a program that will roll out to all FISU-Oceania member countries during 2012-13.

The purpose of this first course was to provide Papua New Guinea students and tertiary education sport representatives with information to assist them in preparing for large events such as the Papua New Guinea University Games. The Course was delivered by AUS (Australian University Sport) National Programs Manager Donna Spethman and supported by OUSA Secretary General Martin Doulton.

A workshop presentation was developed by Donna Spethman and focussed on the following three areas:

- Event management
- Team management
- Club development

The workshop began with introductions on who AUS were and the background on the presenters. Attendees were then asked to identify key questions and issues they wanted answered/addressed over the period of the workshop. These questions and points were highlighted on a whiteboard for all to see for the duration of the two days.

The first day consisted of event management areas. Practical examples were provided for all slides and white board was used to emphasises examples and to note diagrams and support the presentation where required. The focus of this first day was on the five phases of event delivery: Initiation, planning, implementation, delivery and shut down. Real life examples of events were used to distinguish between the time each of these phases would take ie: football world cup would take longer to implement than university games etc.

The second day included a practical session in risk management and enabled the group to see first hand risks associated with events (in this case a

boomerang competition was held and analysed). Team management focused on providing valuable information to teams attending by event organisers. Another key section was to provide to attendees how to prepare and organise their team to attend another event.

At the completion of the two days, a review of the initial questions asked by the group was undertaken to ensure that all issues and questions had been addressed as well as providing a general opportunity for any additional questions to be answered.

Future Program

Upcoming projects include a pilot of future Oceania Championships. This event will be held in conjunction with the Australian University Sport Northern Regional Games between 1-4 July 2012 in Lismore, New South-Wales, Australia. Oceania members will be invited to participate in a wide range of sporting competitions across 21 disciplines.

This event will also coincide with the 2012 FISU-Oceania General Assembly scheduled for the 3rd of July.

ODUPA was founded in Blumenau, Brazil in 2007, to promote the values of sport and promote sports in keeping with the university spirit throughout the diverse continents of Americas. Its mission - to promote the practice of competitive sport as a means comprehensive and quality training in each country and to contribute to human and social values, became a model for the youth of the Pan American continent.

The federation covers Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Curacao, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Sint Maarten, United

States of America, Uruguay and Virgin Islands. OPUPA also works closely with ODUCC – the regional sports federation of Central America and the Caribbean.

The year 2011 was quite active for the federations in the Americas; from national, regional and continental point of view. To illustrate, a few activities are outlined.

May was very active month. The 2nd ODUPA Swimming Championship was hosted in Curacao. The Costa Rican University Sports Games were also held in May, counting more than 1000 athletes from 12 universities, both public and private, across the country. During the 2nd ODUPA Championship, a confer-

ence 'Women's Leadership in University Sport's, was organised by the University Sports Organization of Central America and the Caribbean (ODUCC) in Curacao. In this meeting, which was characterized by equity participation, men and women representatives of all the Americas discussed the topic of gender equality. Seminar on physical activity and sport in higher education institutions was also organised in May in Honduras.

University Taekwondo Tournament was organised in June in Costa Rica, with over 100 participants. End of June, world university sports leaders gathered in Sao Paulo Brazil, to discuss the future of college and university sport, with emphasis on FISU.

In August, several teams from ODUPA member federations took part in the Summer Universiade in Shenzhen, China. During the time of the Universiade, ODUPA also had its General Assembly and elections. The new president of the Pan-American University Sport Federation, Sotero Vasquez, says the biggest challenge of the entity is to walk the path of unity. Sergio Ramirez Molina, ODUPA new treasurer, says it is important to consolidate the sports programs of the region and to achieve greater involvement of member countries in ODUPA.
